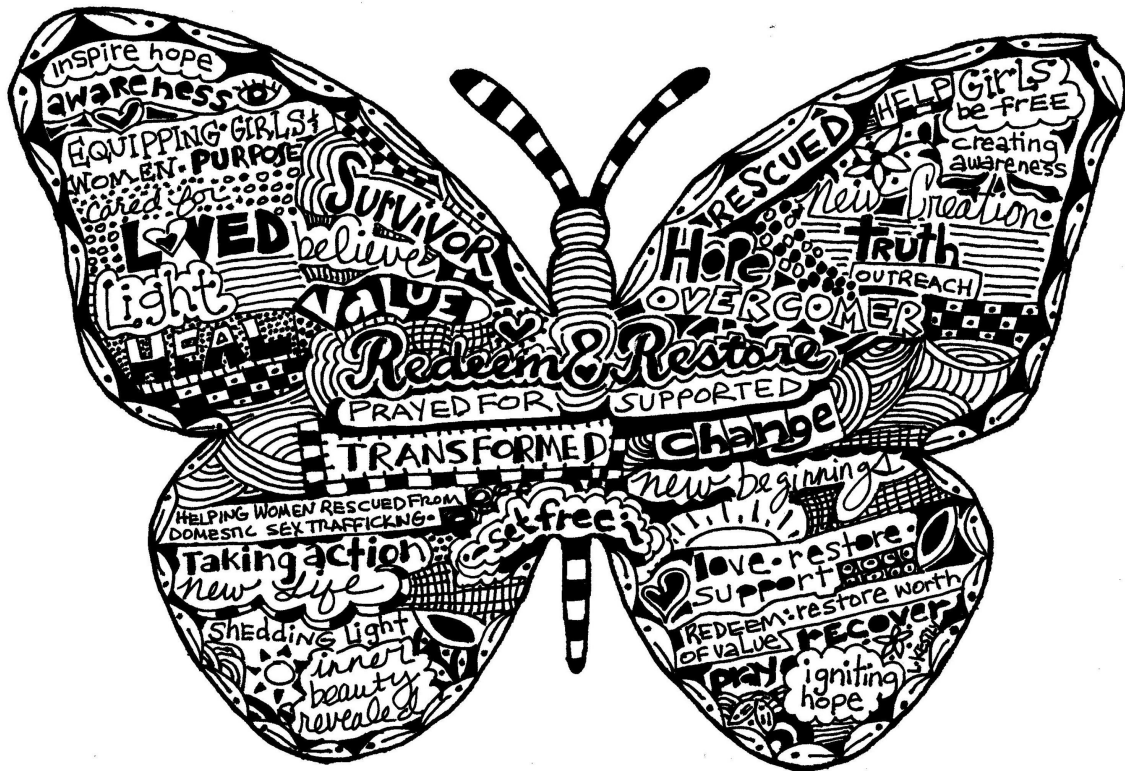

### REDEEM AND RESTORE CENTER

For five years I have worked many hours to learn, grow, and prepare a non-profit that can be successful in our mission to love, restore, and support women escaping sexual exploitation and sex trafficking and operate a long term restoration home that provides a solid foundation of healing for them.

During this time I have: become a public speaker and trainer, Chaplain, Crisis Intervention Specialist, studied and had various trainings on trauma, built relationships throughout Wisconsin and the US, learned how to fundraise and lead volunteers, and come alongside multiple women survivors of sexual exploitation and trafficking, all the while working a few part time jobs for income and flexibility. A journey that has stretched and blessed me in so many ways! Never would I have imagined doing what I am, but now can't imagine doing anything different.

2018 did not go how I wanted. I had expected much more. This is a huge undertaking! This is God's plan to love, restore, and support women and open our restoration home for them. He is able- yet we must strive for excellence and plan to be sustainable. As we move towards the purchase of a home and then prepare for opening, there is so much more to do that I hadn't been able to previously. By the end of the year, the board of directors and I had decided it was time for me to move into a full time role. I am expectant for what He will do through us in the coming year!

## IN THEIR WORDS



"Women need a safe place to fall apart. We need rest along with appropriate trauma counseling and programming. We cannot be quickly pushed into finding another job when our brains are still in a traumatized state. Recovery is hugely dependent on having a strong, non-judging, secure, consistent, and effective support system committed to the survivors. Without all this, redemption and restoration is nearly impossible."

A place where they are not trying to make you into something you're not -just love you. Offering the support that we will so vitally need at the time. In the spring she completed the Waukesha County Sheriffs Citizens Academy, and in the fall she completed the FBI Citizens Academy. She continues on as alumni with each organization to continue to build relationships and show our support for local law enforcement.

She also attended a trafficking sustainability conference to learn more details regarding securing a strong foundation and a sustainable future for our organization.

We have partnered again with multiple groups to reach the communities around us and in Wisconsin: Community task forces, other non-profits, and multiple churches. We will continue to build networking and partnerships throughout Wisconsin to provide whatever support is needed for each survivor that we meet.

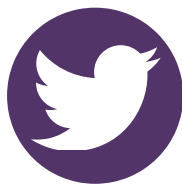
