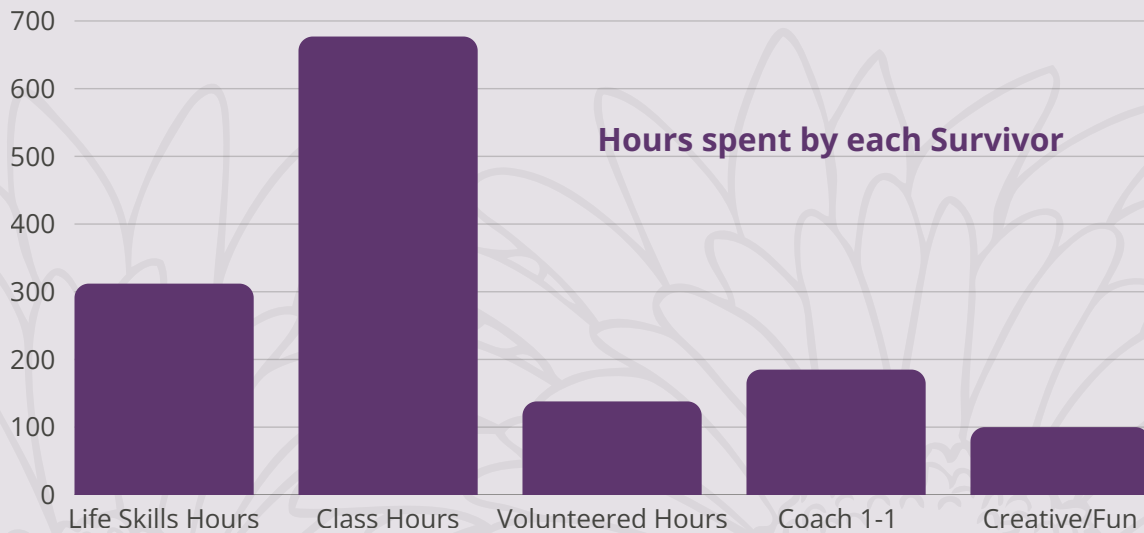

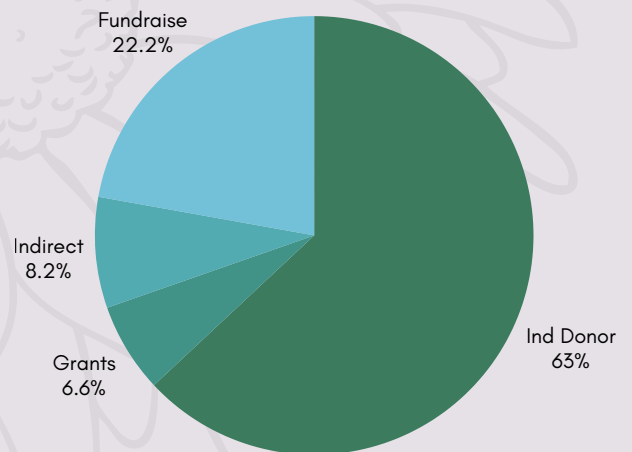
THE HOME

This year, one of the women residing in the Redeem and Restore Home is preparing for graduation—and her story is nothing short of remarkable. The first three months were filled with resistance, questions, and a lot of wrestling with God. But by month nine, she began speaking with anticipation about being baptized. She admitted that the classes they take as part of their healing process stretch her in ways she never expected. Even so, she refused to give up. Instead, she kept showing up, doing the work, and allowing God to shape her through it. At the one-year mark, she was baptized. She also bravely chose to begin reducing one of her medications and started recognizing and breaking long-standing relational patterns. By eighteen months, she was ready to reduce another medication.

She now delights in reading her Bible nearly every day, processes her emotions and decisions with God, and carries a renewed sense of hope as she makes plans for her future. Her growth has accelerated month after month. To witness such a profound transformation in such a short time is truly one of the most beautiful gifts of this ministry.

OUTREACH

Prayer support is huge, but the workers are few. Thanks to Kristie’s sensitivity to the Holy Spirit, we’ve had powerful, targeted times of prayer at several strip clubs. We’re building genuine relationships through meals, personal notes, small gifts, sweet conversations, and now a mini library basket filled with books for these ladies that speak to God’s love and His desire for each of them to know Him.

THE DIRECTION GOD IS LEADING US

As we seek His direction, it's clear He is calling us to prepare for more. We are beginning to strategize and make plans for the next steps He is leading us to take.

In 2025, we received **73 referrals** from survivors desperately seeking help. Heartbreakingly, **50 of those** had to be turned away immediately—not because they lacked desire or need, but because they required a level of stabilization before they could enter the restorative care that the Redeem and Restore home provides. Many were in homeless shelters, some were simply searching for a temporary safe place to live, others had been sexually exploited within the last 30 days, and many were still actively using drugs. These women absolutely need help. They absolutely want help. But the Redeem and Restore home—by God's design—is a place for long-term healing, structure, and transformation. It is the next step on their journey, not the first step.

We are also seeing another gap: after graduation, ongoing support and stable housing are difficult to secure. These women are stepping into new lives, but they still need community, accountability, and a safe place to continue growing. God is showing us that His mission doesn't end at graduation—it continues as they rebuild their lives with Him.

Because of these **two critical gaps**—before and after the Redeem and Restore Home—we believe God is calling us to expand the continuum of care we can offer to the survivors. We are prayerfully exploring the development of a campus-style property where multiple stages of care can exist in separate buildings but on the same land. This would allow us to walk with survivors **from crisis to stability to independence**, all within one Christ-centered facility.

We are seeking God's direction as we take these next steps, trusting Him to provide the resources, property, and partners needed to make this expanded continuum of care a reality. He is the One who rescues, restores, and transforms—and we simply want to follow where He is moving. You are invited to partner with us!
